<p>Do people speak Euskera in the streets?</p>	<p>Everybody in San Sebastián speaks Spanish and more than 40% of the people speak Euskera (Basque language) as well. Some people speak Euskera between them but will switch to Spanish if they see you don't understand it. Euskera is very different from Spanish so there's no risk you mix the two languages. On your first day we will teach you some words in Euskera and we're sure you'll pick up some others during your stay with us.</p>
<p>Is the city safe?</p>	<p>San Sebastian is a human sized city and very safe with a very low crime rate. However, this is still a city and you have to be careful with your belongings at the beach for example.</p>
<p>What's the weather like?</p>	<p>San Sebastian features an oceanic climate with cool winters and warm summers. Due to its geographical position surrounded by mountains and ocean, the city can experience cloudy conditions and heavy rainfalls all year long but is much drier in summer. The mild summer temperatures make it possible to enjoy the region's beautiful beaches and mountains without being under a scorching sun: a perfect climate to Study Spanish and enjoy the city. In winter temperatures do not go down too much, with an average of 10°C making San Sebastian an enjoyable destination all year long</p>



<p>What does the city offer?</p>	<p>We want to share with you why we are in love with our city as San Sebastián has a lot to offer to everybody. If you like the ocean you will love our 3 urban beaches and all the activities you can practice (swimming, surfing, kayaking, Stand up Paddle...), the foodies will enjoy our strong Gastronomy culture with our worldwide famous Pintxos, our sociedades (private cooking clubs), our cider houses, our Michelin stars restaurants and all our traditional markets with fresh and local products.</p> <p>If you are more into design and architecture you will appreciate wandering in our Belle Epoque style city center. The mountain lovers will go hiking on the Pyrenees and on the Way of St James. The City has a great cultural offer all year long with live concerts, international festivals (movies, Jazz), Surf contests, traditional celebrations...</p>
<p>Which are the essentials of the city/ Basque country that I should not miss?</p>	<p>There's a lot to do in Basque Country for every taste and every budget. Here are some recommendations.</p> <p>San Telmo Museum is the biggest museum for Basque History and culture and is located in an amazing building in the heart of San Sebastian.</p> <p>Monte Igueldo is situated west of San Sebastián and can be accessed via a funicular. In addition to a breathtaking view of the Bay you can also enjoy a vintage theme park.</p> <p>La Playa de La Concha is definitely one of the symbol of the city, we are pretty sure you will love to cool off in the blue water after your Spanish Class.</p> <p>Try our gastronomy: there's a lot to experiment: a glass of Txakoli (sparkling white wine) in Getaria, a pintxo in Hondarribia, a cider house in Astigarraga and much more.</p> <p>Try a surf class in la Zurriola in San Sebastián or in Zarautz, an internationally well-known Surf Spot</p> <p>Enjoy the landscapes of Zumaia and San Juan de Gaztelugatxe. Because of Gaztelugatxe's extraordinary nature and beauty, HBO filmed Games of Thrones season 7 here.</p> <p>Don't miss Bilbao and Guggenheim museum - the building itself is a work of art.</p> <p>San Sebastian is perfectly located to explore its surroundings: we are only 20 kilometers from France, 1 hour away from Vitoria and Pamplona and close to the Pyrenees. The north of Spain has a stunning coastline. We are also close to La Rioja and its vineyards. The Basque Country is riddled with hidden gems like Urdaibai, several caves on the interior, outstretched nature parks and much more.</p>



<p>How to get to San Sebastián?</p>	<p>San Sebastian is well connected both nationally and internationally. You can get to San Sebastian by plane (public transportation or private transfer from Bilbao, San Sebastián and Biarritz airports) , by bus (the bus station is only 1 minute walking from school) , by train (to San Sebastian or Hendaye (France) train stations or by car (we do rent parking spots in our school)</p>

<p>How are my teachers?</p>	<p>Our teachers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Are especially trained, very experienced and extremely passionate about what they do. > Participate in in-house training and attend external training sessions. > Are the selected best teachers that have completed the International House Teacher Training Course
<p>What is my schedule like?</p>	<p>The schedule for the Intensive 20 course is from 09.30 – 13.00 with a break from 11.00 to 11.30 In high season some classes take place in the afternoon. We will inform you about this in the week before your course. Individual lessons can be organized in low season in the morning or in the afternoon and in high season only in the afternoon. Please contact us if you have any specific questions.</p>
<p>How do you assess my improvement in Spanish?</p>	<p>We do believe in continuous assessment with an exam every 2 weeks. If you want to do an additional final exam you just have to ask your teacher or our Head of Studies. We are also able to provide you with a Personal Report with your participation and improvements.</p>
<p>What will I do on the first day of school?</p>	<p>You will have a level test on your first day (written if you haven't done it online and oral) to assess your level. During the speaking part, the teacher will identify your weaknesses and will also ask you about your interests and motivation to learn Spanish to get to know you better.</p>
<p>What is the methodology used and what is the content of my classes?</p>	<p>Our methodology is focused on the practice and use of Spanish language for communication from day one. We have divided our Intensive classes into two sessions: The first one from 09:30 to 11:00 dedicated to linguistic contents always oriented to communication (for example being able to tell a story using past tenses) and a second one from 11:30 to 13:00 focused on vocabulary and role playing (what would you say in a shop or in a restaurant?)</p>




<p>Is the material included?</p>	<p>Our total beginners students use the Book Etapas Plus A1 (you'll be able to buy it at school for 18€). The other levels are using the material prepared by their teacher at no additional cost.</p>
<p>Will I be placed with other students of my age?</p>	<p>If you sign up in our Junior Summer Course you will be with other teenagers from 14 to 17 years old. In our Intensive Courses for Adults we welcome students from 17 to 99 years old. More than the age we are focused on placing students according to their level of Spanish and weaknesses (past tenses, vocabulary, grammar) making the learning process much more efficient.</p>
<p>Will I be able to move to another a group?</p>	<p>Despite of your level test, if you think your level is higher/ lower than the rest of the group you'll be able to speak with your teacher and our Director of Studies. We will discuss it with you and offer your alternative solutions.</p>
<p>Can I have holiday during my long term stay?</p>	<p>If you enroll in a Trimestral Course you will be able to enjoy 1 week off that you'll be able to make up at the beginning or at the end of your stay. If you stay a whole year with us you will be able to have 2 weeks off. You'll need to let your teacher know and send an email to our Director of Studies (dos@lacunza.com). The schedule should be arranged and approved in advance by the school</p>
<p>What support can offer the school?</p>	<p>You'll have at your disposal various novels and Spanish manuals in our library that you can use and rent. Moreover, if you want to revise a specific subject such as ser/estar, por/para you'll be able to sign up to our Spanish tutoring held every week during 1 hour for free. You will need to sign up before Monday 1 PM and let your teacher know what you would need to revise.</p>
<p>How fast will I learn?</p>	<p>It really depends on every student regarding your current level, the other languages you may speak, how much Spanish you can practice out of the class and how dedicated you are Our Director Of Studies is able to provide you with a personal report to follow up your results and help you to keep improving. You just need to ask for it sending him an email: dos@lacunza.com</p>



ENROLLMENT

<p>How can I get a VISA for Spain?</p>	<p>If you stay more than 3 months and need a student VISA, we can help you in the VISA application process by providing you with the right documentation such as letter of invitation and the enrolment confirmation. If you request an official Confirmation of Enrolment Certificate or Letter of Invitation (carta de invitación) from Lacunza IH, you must pay 50% of the total course before the certificate is issued.</p> <p>In case the visa is denied, firstly you must send the Visa Denial, and, in this case, we will refund the total payment of the course less 200€ that stands for administration costs and that you'll be able to use for another booking within the same year. The reimbursement will be made through Bank Transfer, if applicable. Charges for bank transfer must be covered by the client. All expenses such as express delivery documents will be covered by the client.</p>
<p>How many students per class</p>	<p>There are 4-12 students per class</p>
<p>Can I get a quote?</p>	<p>Of course, just tell us the dates and the courses/accommodation option you prefer, and we send you a personalized free quotation.</p>
<p>Health & Cancellation Insurance</p>	<p>We recommend the cancellation insurance for all our students. We work with guard.me and we offer a Multi-risk insurance for 0,90€ per day. Please contact us for more information about guaranteed risks.</p>
<p>When can I start my course?</p>	<p>We have special dates for total beginners - please check on our website or brochure. If you've already studied some Spanish, you can start every Monday (less the first and last week of the year).</p>
<p>Last minute enrollments</p>	<p>If you decide to enroll less than 20 days before arrival, please check the availability before the enrollment and make sure to pay the full amount directly in order to receive all relevant information.</p>
<p>What is the family pack?</p>	<p>Learn Spanish as a family. Our Family Pack is flexible, fun and customized for each family! Choose from private Spanish classes as a family or take part in our general Spanish courses with INTENSIVE 20 classes for parents, Junior Summer Course for teens and Lacunza Summer Camp for kids. An educational and enjoyable holiday experience for the whole family! Please contact us for further information.</p>



<p>Can I make modifications?</p>	<p>You can change the dates/courses/accommodation etc. till 20 days before the arrival without any extra cost. If you want to change something 19 days or less before arrival, there will be an extra cost of 50€.</p>
<p>Can I cancel my course?</p>	<p>Yes, of course. Please find our general conditions on our website and in our current brochure.</p>
<p>What happens on the bank holidays?</p>	<p>On bank holidays the school will be closed, and we will make up for most of the group classes by starting 30 minutes earlier on the other days. We will also make up for the private lessons. You will be informed about the exact schedule on your first day.</p>
<p>Are there any discounts for longer stays?</p>	<p>Reduced prices for long term discounts apply only when requested and paid in advance (the total amount). Please note you can always add more lessons to your booking but on the opposite, you cannot reduce the number of lessons once the course has started.</p>
<p>Do I have to pay in advance?</p>	<p>We need to receive a deposit of 200€ within 10 days after the enrollment. The rest amount needs to be paid at least 20 days before the course starts.</p>



ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation is booked from Sunday before the course begins to Saturday after the course ends.

Extra nights might be available (extra cost) and can be booked on Saturday (arrival) or Sunday (departure).

They need to be reserved in advance.

All accommodation is located within 5 to 30 minutes from the school, either by walking or by public transport.

Except for the Residence hall, double rooms are only available for students coming together to do a course. We do not let students who do not know each other share rooms.

Our accommodation is only available for people during the period of their course. Guest visits are not allowed in any of our accommodations, not even for one night.

The minimum length of accommodation is one week.

What different types of accommodation do we offer?

These are the different types of accommodation that we offer:

- **Host family** with different board options (NO access to kitchen)
- **Shared Apartments** (with access to kitchen) to share with San Sebastian residents or other Lacunza students (depending on availability)
- The **students' residence Hall** (NO access to kitchen)
- **Private apartments**. (to be booked at least 2 months in advance)

Host families and shared apartments include a shared bathroom unless you add the private bathroom option in your booking.

What is realistic to expect from the housing of the school?

San Sebastian - Donostia, together with Madrid and Barcelona are among the **most expensive cities to live in Spain**. As we understand that you need an accommodation while doing your Spanish Course, we try to keep the prices for the accommodation **as low as possible**.

Therefore, our accommodations are **adequate** but **simple** and scattered around the city. If you want to be sure that you are located in a specific area, you want to live with your family or friends, or you want to ensure a lovely decorated apartment, we recommend you to book a private apartment.

Most Spanish people and families live in **flats**, not houses. Those are average between 70-90 square meters, usually with 2-3 bedrooms, one bathroom, a living/ dining space and a small kitchen with a washing machine for clothes. Not everybody has dishwashers or clothes dryers and space can often be tight in the bedrooms.

This makes quite difficult for us to have houses with room available for 3 students together.

	<p>Living in the city center and the areas closer to school/surfing beach means that you will have everything on hand. But at the same time and due to Spanish construction standards, many rooms might not have a window that overlooks the street. The windows are opened to small ventilation patios so rooms can be quite dark. This has the advantage of avoiding the street noise, which can be quite heavy as we are used to make most of our lives outside our flats, in bars and cafeterias until late at night.</p> <p>Brighter areas are found on the suburbs on the hills that surround the city center or newly build up areas. Those areas are efficiently communicated by bike lanes and bus/train service. Most of the residents limit the use of their cars to weekends and use public transport, walk or cycle as the city is safe and easy to move around.</p> <p>All our housings offer WIFI connection.</p> <p>For safety reasons, bedrooms do not have a lock.</p>
<p>What is the distance between the school and the accommodations?</p>	<p>>Host families and shared apartments are scattered all around the city: 5-30 minutes distance (walking or using public transport) from the school</p> <p>>The students' residence is located in the area of "Antiguo", close to universities in the west of the city, but not so close to our school which is in the east. Nevertheless, we invite you to walk to city center as the promenade along the bay is of an unparallel beauty. If you prefer to use public transport, the area is serviced by public buses and special bike lanes.</p> <p>>To make easier the way to school for young students (Juniors) living in specific areas of the city, the host family will provide a bus pass. The student will leave a 5€ deposit in exchange, to be refund when they give back the pass. The family will make a courtesy first charge so that he/she can come and go to school for the first 5 days. After that it will be the student's responsibility to pay to recharge it, with the help of their host.</p>
<p>Can I book a private bathroom?</p>	<p>Yes, it can be booked for host families and shared apartments with an extra cost depending on availability</p> <p>For the shared apartments with private bathrooms we need to receive your booking minimum 1 month before arrival to guarantee a private bathroom</p>
<p>Check-in and Check-out</p>	<p>Except for Residence Hall where the reception is open 24/24 hours, the check in will be from 18: 00 until 23:30. If you need to arrive sooner/later, please notify your Host family or us (for the shared apartments) by Tuesday before arrival.</p> <p>Check-out until 11-12 a.m. If you need to leave later you will need to empty your room but you can store your luggage at the apartment after talking to the school or your host.</p> <p>Residence - Rooms are booked from Sunday at midday to the following Saturday at midday. If the student arrives earlier than</p>



	<p>midday they are able to leave their luggage at Reception. It is highly recommended to let Lacunza IH know what the expected arrival time is.</p>
<p>Which accommodation is more suitable for me?</p>	<p>All types of accommodation offer pros & cons. But basically:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Family option with half board: if you are looking for a plus of practice of what you've seen during the lessons, go for the half board family option as dinner is the perfect time to put your Spanish into practice. It includes a light continental breakfast (coffee/tea, toast and juice or a fruit). - Family option with full board: is only aimed for our junior students as they have all together lunch at the park under the monitor's supervision, with the pack lunch provided by host family. - Family option with B&B: includes just a light, continental breakfast (coffee/tea, toast, and juice or a fruit). Be aware that most of families leave for work quite early and cannot have breakfast with the students. They might spend some time with you after dinner or during the afternoon and you also get to know the lifestyle and customs of the country from inside. Remember you will not be able to use the kitchen. - Shared apartments with Lacunza Students: living with other students from Lacunza will be for sure fun and guarantees you will meet people to share plans outside the lessons. But...Students tend to resort to English rather than Spanish and this will not help your practice/ learning. - Shared apartments with San Sebastian residents: those have the advantage of keeping your independence while practicing your Spanish here and there. Also, the flats are usually better kept than the shared flats, where the responsibility towards cleaning is always diffused.
<p>Which is the host family profile?</p>	<p>We have a large variety of responsible and trustworthy families of different types and lifestyles to ensure that we find the perfect matching for you. The main criteria for selecting a host family is that they are caring, friendly, open-minded and will be able to offer the student a welcoming home stay that supports and encourage their languages learning and cultural immersion.</p> <p>We will do our best to fulfil the request of the parents/ students regarding their host family, if those are reasonable and do not imply any discrimination towards host families.</p> <p>We are aware that most people expect a nuclear family with a mother, father and as far as possible, children. Unfortunately host families with children/ teenagers are not that frequent as most host families live in flats, not houses where they do not have a guest room. Also, many local families work hard, so they do neither have the time nor the energy to participate in our Host family Program. That's why we have already collaborated with different types of hosts that are also happy to welcome you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A lady living alone - A young couple without children



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A man alone with/ without children (not frequent) - Gay couple as it is legal to be a gay married couple in Spain (not frequent)
<p>How do you select your host families?</p>	<p>At Lacunza Ih we are aware that the housing experience is an essential part of your language learning. This is why all our families are subject to careful selection. If we have any doubts about the facilities being provided or more importantly the family themselves, we DO NOT USE THAT FAMILY.</p> <p>The families are visited by a representative of the school at their house to check that they can offer a suitable welcome to our students. No family enters the program without being previously visited and assessed by a representative of our school.</p> <p>The main criteria for selecting a host family should be that they are caring, friendly, open-minded and will be able to offer the student a welcoming home stay, who supports and encourage their language learning and cultural immersion.</p> <p>Families that will host the young students in the Junior Program should provide the official certificate of police check.</p> <p>We are aware that some of the children will be leaving their own families and travelling abroad for the first time, which can cause stress, cultural shock and feeling homesick. Therefore when visiting and assessing our host families we make them aware they have to do all they can to help them to overcome any fears or apprehension the teenagers may feel and to offer a warm, secure and welcoming family environment.</p> <p>That's why we prioritize offering them a specially caring family, even if not so close to school and city center. As families with children tend to live in suburbs around the city center, where students will need to use public transport to come and go to school, <u>we offer the possibility of getting a bus pass</u> that will reduce the price of the trip to come and go from school. In order to get the bus pass students must give a deposit of 5€ to their host family on their first day. The family will charge the card for 6 days return trip to school. After that the student must recharge the card with their own money.</p>
<p>How do you make your matchings? Can I make request for the housing?</p>	<p>We are especially careful about the assignments student/ host family and we always take into account the students' request when doing our placements if those are reasonable and do not imply any discrimination towards host families.</p> <p>But due to the fact that we work on the basis "First come, first served", sometimes there are no more available houses left with those request (for egg children or close to school) so we need you to tell us which is your priority.</p>



	<p>For our younger students, as it might be the first time they travel alone, we tend to prioritize the family environment (safe, welcoming and caring housing) to the distance to the beach or city center. If you prefer the opposite because your child is mature and independent, please let us know.</p> <p>All the info you can provide is really helpful in order to have successful matchings and ensuring you have an enjoyable stay.</p>
<p>Can I contact the family before my stay?</p>	<p>Yes, we would like you to do so! We will send you a confirmation with a full description of the housing situation, including a telephone number or an email-address to contact your host at least 10 days before your stay and once we have received full payment for the course as well as all necessary documents. In this way you can start a contact and inform them about your arrival time. Please do it by Tuesday before arrival the latest.</p>
<p>What should I expect from the living together?</p>	<p>Our host families and San Sebastian residents in shared apartments are opening their houses to you in order to share culture and experiences. Some of them do it because they want their children to know how it feels before sending them abroad, some other want to be accompanied and some others see in it a nice way to broaden their world from home. They are not guest houses, B&B or professionals, making their living on this, but a service just for our students, with specific conditions. Therefore, students need to understand they are living at someone's else house and they need to adapt to their rules and customs, rather than thinking they are in a hotel.</p> <p>Avoid having long showers or showering 3 times a day (and especially after 21:00), leaving the lights on when you go out of the house or even keeping your room with food store in it or untidy. Think about how to show respect for your host and his/her home and do your best to treat them as you would like to be treated. That will be good way to establish an enjoyable atmosphere.</p> <p>Talking with your host/ resident about their timetables and customs and offering them help with small chore task will also help the co-habitation. Also, the areas of common use must be treated with respect especially referring to their cleanness.</p> <p>All accommodations are different from the point of view of the flat, the location and the host/ resident. But all of them have been checked by a representative of the school and have been considered they can offer a welcoming environment for your learning experience.</p>
<p>Will it be possible to change my accommodation?</p>	<p>Please think carefully about which accommodation is more suitable for you as once you are here it will not be possible for you to change from one type to another (residence to host family or host family to apartment and so on). If you have doubts about what can be more</p>



	<p>convenient for you, our accommodation team will be pleased to assess you at oficina@lacunza.com</p> <p>Changes of accommodation once it has started will only be accepted under extenuating circumstances, which will include the accommodation is not meeting the school's expectations in accommodating the student. If that situation happened, we will provide a new accommodation as quick as possible.</p> <p>Be sure that we will not keep a student feeling unhappy in a host family/ shared apartment. But we need as well to preserve our accommodation providers for future students. So in case a student wishes to change for personal reasons (better location, not having much in common with the family/ local resident or not liking the house/ room) a change fee of 50€ will be applied. Those changes depend always on availability.</p>
<p>Will it be possible to extend my accommodation?</p>	<p>If once here you decide to extend your accommodation please let us know ASAP as there might be another student assigned to your room after you.</p> <p>Extensions will not have priority over students that have already been confirmed their accommodation.</p> <p>When the student needs to change the accommodation for the extension it will be necessary to pay 25€ (half the placement fee) and one extra night. If you don't change the accommodation you only pay the extra night.</p>
<p>Is it possible to cancel my accommodation?</p>	<p>>Cancelling your accommodation 19 working days before your starting date will result in a total refund less the €50 registration fee.</p> <p>>Cancelling less than 19 working days before your starting date, the school will refund 50% of the total accommodation price</p> <p>>After starting your accommodation, there will be no refund.</p>
<p>Insurance and responsibility.</p>	<p>In order to ensure the quality of our shared apartment we will ask for a housing deposit of 150€ (to be paid by credit card). We will return that amount to your credit card after you leave if there is no damage to the apartment.</p> <p>In case there was a damage to the accommodation or property lost, involuntary or not, students will be responsible for it. This includes but is not limited to: losing house keys (and replacing lock if necessary), losing the bus pass (if you have been offered one) or replacing/ fixing damaged property.</p>



<p>What's included and what's not included.</p>	<p>Even if most of our host agree to provide more than this, the school guarantees:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Bed linen, for both shared flats and host families. - Bath towels in the host families, but not beach towels. - Cookery & cutlery in the share apartments. - A daily shower, but not baths and no after 9pm showers. - A weekly change of bed linen& basic laundering of the clothes (if you arrive with dirty clothes from travelling you can take them to a laundry) - A key, so that the students may let themselves in and out. - An individual room (unless you come accompanied) with a wardrobe, and a table/ desk to study. - WIFI connection.
<p>Special diets.</p>	<p>Vegan and vegetarian families are rare in Spain, where we follow a Mediterranean diet. Also, we do not have families that are gluten free or lactose free so that they can host our students. And no one that eats kosher or halal. Therefore, families that host student with extra diets need to make an effort to cook a special menu for those cases.</p> <p>For this reason, there will be an extra fee of 25€/ week for the following special diets: gluten free, vegetarian & pescatarian, lactose intolerance, vegan.</p>

ACTIVITIES
